

# Fingerless Mitten Duo.....

Craft Leftovers

I wear my lady moss mittens on walks, outdoor excursions, going to class, etc. Basically when I know that I will be outside for more than five minutes. It's my fingerless mittens that I wear just about everywhere else. To the store, in class, in my apartment, to the mail box, taking out the trash. Unfortunately, being my first project ever made from a pattern, they are starting to show a lot of wear. Not to mention the fact that they are lime green, a perfect color really, but lately I have been leaning to more neutrals, reds, blues, and sage green (am I getting old and dull at just 24 years old?). Not to mention the fact that I have a friend who would just love a pair too! Hence the duo pattern, crochet for me, knit for her. Try out both and give a pair to a friend and keep one for you!

## Ingredients:

1 skein of chunky wool such as Mauch Chunky or Lamb's Pride Bulky

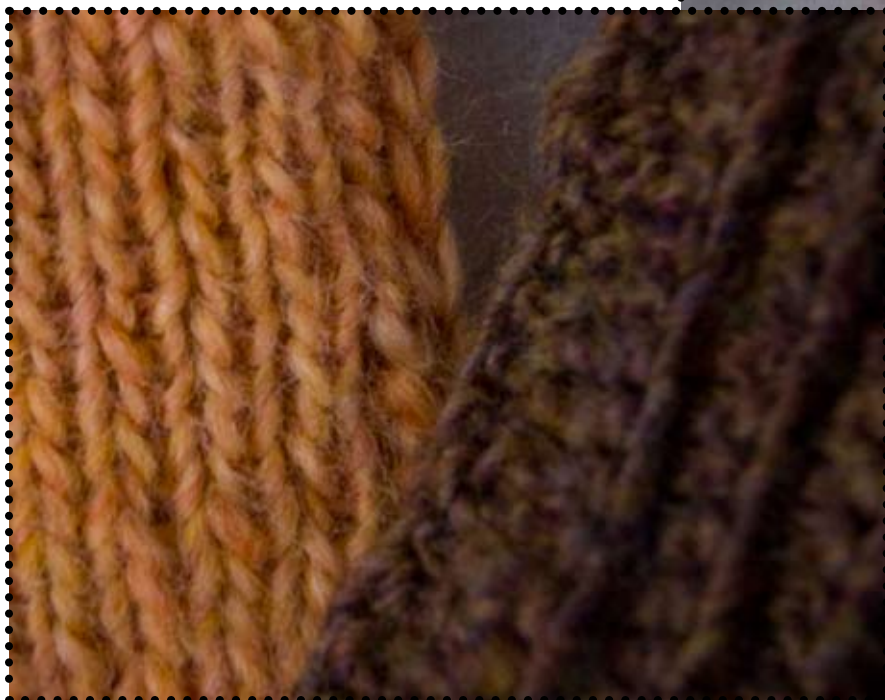
For crochet:

Size D/3mm hook

For Knit:

Size 8 US/ 5mm

Crochet hook



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Crochet Directions & Notes:

Chain 34

Row 1: 1sc into 2nd Ch from hook. 1 sc in ea ch to end. Ch 1. Turn

Row 2: 1sc into ea sc through the back loop to end. Turn.

Repeat row 2 eleven times.

Short row shaping:

1sc into the back loop of first 19 sts. Ch 1. Turn

1sc into the back loop of ea st to end. Ch 1. Turn

1sc into the back loop of ea st to end, tighten the st over the row gap created by the short row so a hole does not form. Ch1. Turn.

Repeat row 2 eleven times.

Cut yarn and leave a foot long tail. Seam up side according to end finishing notes.

Abbreviations:

Ch=chain

Sc = single crochet

Ea = each

St = stitch



Knit Directions & Notes:

CO 32 (36, 40)

Work 1x1 rib (k1, p1) for 4 inches.

Increase row: (k1, p1) 7 times, kfb next two stitches, (k1, p1) to end (2 sts increased)

Work 1x1 rib until piece measures 8 3/4 inches.

BO all stitch.

Seam up sides according to end finishing notes.

Abbreviations:

CO = cast on

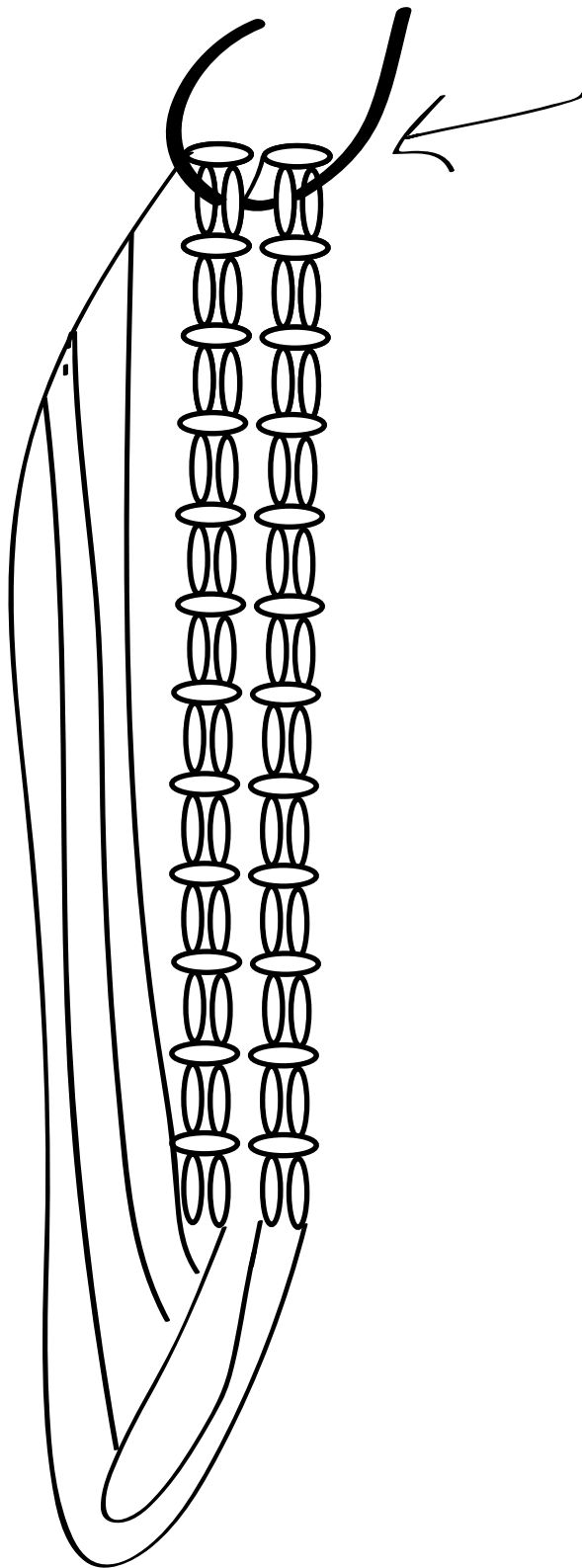
K = knit

P = purl

Kfb = knit through the front and then the back of one stitch (increase)

BO = bind off





Starting at the ending row with your long tail. Sc through inner vertical bars along your chain/end row or for your knitting your co/bo rows.

Sc though the vertical bars for 3 inches. Cut yarn, pull through loop, and weave in. Skip 1 1/2 inches and Sc though inner bars to end. Cut yarn, pull through loop, weave in all ends.
